

Statement of Accessibility

Money in Minutes continues its commitment to providing a website accessible to the largest possible audience, regardless of technology or ability. In order to further this commitment, Money in Minutes staff contracted an independent third-party (Promet Source) for an accessibility audit and review according to [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines \(WCAG\) 2.0 level AA](#) guidelines.

On March 12, 2018, Promet Source concluded its manual review of the Money in Minutes website and digital properties, consisting of the following pages located at the attached URLs:

Additionally, on March 12, 2018, Promet Source concluded its automated review of the Money in Minutes website and its digital properties contained therein. The properties involved were provided as a sitemap (available upon request). The automated review provided a comprehensive list of any compliance issues in addition to warnings.

Due to Money in Minutes' integration with external vendors within the site remain beyond Money in Minutes' control. These elements include (but is not limited to) a11y Toolbar, Gravity Forms Styles Pro, Google Apps, Yoast Plugins, WordPress, Sitselinks Search Box, Slider Revolution, UberMenu, Twitter, jQuery prettyPhoto, jQuery ScrollTo, and Lightbox. Until the integration with these vendors is resolved, Money in Minutes can only achieve a partial level of conformance according to WCAG.

Promet Source has concluded its accessibility audit and has provided the results to Money in Minutes.

Money in Minutes is actively working to increase the accessibility and usability of the website and in doing so adheres to many of the available standards and guidelines.

Money in Minutes does not discriminate in its education and employment programs on the basis of religion, age, race, color, national origin, gender, marital or parental status, or disability and complies with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990.

- Your name
- Your address
- Your contact information (email and telephone number)
- The date of the complaint
- A description of the problem encountered
- The URL (web address) or location of the problem page
- Solution desired
